What is CETIM ?

CETIM (Europe – Third World Centre) is a not-for-profit organization established in Geneva in 1970. As a center for study, research and information focused on the mechanisms at the origin of the world's underdevelopment, CETIM is an interface between the social movements of the Global South and North in gaining access to the <u>United Nations</u> human rights protection mechanisms.

An Organization Active at the United Nations in support of social movements

The CETIM supports social movements of the Global South in gaining access to the <u>United Nations</u> human rights protection mechanisms and participating in the drafting of new international human rights norms.

CETIM (Europe – Third World Centre)"There is not a developed world and an underdeveloped world but a single world badly developed."

It also carries out information and training work on human rights with its partners and the general public.

<u>A Publishing House</u> <u>Unlike Any Other</u>

CETIM is a <u>publishing</u> <u>house</u> dealing with North-South relations and development questions. These books aim to supply the general public with the tools needed to understand the world's globalization reality and the ways to transform it.

A Specialized

Documentation Center The CETIM provides to the wide public its documentation center with over 3,000 volumes and periodicals on topics such as development, environment, trade, foreign debt, food sovereignty, transnational corporations and human rights.



Access to justice

The CETIM defends victims of human rights violations in the Global South. It supports their representatives in gaining access to and obtaining the intervention of the United Nations protection mechanisms, where required.

The CETIM mainly works with peasant organizations, trade unions and organizations representing victims or communities affected by TNCs operations, in Colombia, Ecuador, Guatemala, Madagascar, Nigeria, Philippines and Brazil, among other places.

Human Rights Series

The <u>CETIM's series on the</u> <u>Human rights</u> aim to inform and educate those who strive to achieve respect and implementation of these rights and help to strengthen the capacities of its partner organizations in the Global South.

These <u>publications</u> concern the <u>economic</u>, <u>social and</u> <u>cultural rights</u>, as well as the <u>peasants' rights</u> and <u>fight</u> <u>against the impunity of the</u> <u>TNC (Transnational</u>

<u>Corporations</u>), etc. They are designed as instructive guides, available in three languages (French, English and Spanish) and are <u>easily accessible</u> <u>through our public web site for</u> <u>free</u>.

Training, information

The CETIM accompanies, informs and trains various social movements, withouttaking over.Our aim is to provide them with the means which will allow them to defend themselves autonomously.

Transnational corporations (TNCs) commit crimes, violate human rights and destroy the environment with complete impunity. They avoid any national legal liabilities thanks to their transnational status and economic power. Binding standards at the international level will help to end TNCs' impunity.

The UN Declaration on the Rights of Peasants, an essential instrument, result of a long struggle by CETIM and its partners, helps to better protect them.
